The conference also features several diverse cultural activities and visits, including "Walk and Talk" networking sessions, a private visit to an exhibition organised by the King Baudouin Foundation and other major European foundations in the Musée du Cinquantenaire, and an EFC-hosted exhibition in Philanthropy House, showcasing a wide range of its members' projects on improving social spaces and the restoration of buildings, parks, museums etc.

Taking advantage of the conference, the EFC, along with DAFNE and EVPA, will organise a "Philanthropy Scrum" on 28 May. It will bring together 120 actors from the philanthropy sector, policymakers and other stakeholders to explore ways of working together to create a single market for philanthropy in Europe.
